The Cape Charles Cup is **THE** Cruising event for serious Racers
and **THE** Racing event for serious Cruisers!

The Saturday leg is from Little Creek to Cape Charles. Enjoy the after-race party at Oyster Farm Marina at Kings Creek, have dinner and drinks with friends, and sightsee or shop at the marina or in Cape Charles. Call Oyster Farm Marina for slip reservations at (757) 331-8640. You must be entered to obtain a slip – please allow 3 business days after entering before you call for reservations. Docking at Cape Charles Harbor continues to be an option for those who may be concerned about channel depth; (757) 331-2357. Shuttle service will be available to and from the Cape Charles Harbor Marina.

Entry Fee: \$95.00 if received by July 20, \$115 if received thereafter. Please provide a picture of the boat and/or crew to be included in the yearbook (pictures must be e-mailed to CCCPics@broadbaysailing.org by July 20 to be included, unless your boat was pictured in last year's Cape Charles Cup Yearbook). Entry fee includes registration, one Cape Charles Cup hat and tee shirt, four Saturday dinner tickets, a Cape Charles Cup skipper's bag loaded with useful and/or interesting stuff, a great party at Oyster Farm Marina on Saturday, and the final trophy presentation and celebration on Tuesday, September 20th.

Entries and Deadline: Use the special Cape Charles Cup entry form on the next page or at www.CCCup.net.
Entries close at 1500 hours on August 8th.

Info/Questions Contact: Randy Goodman at 757-348-7921 or CCCPup@broadbaysailing.org. Sailing Instructions can be obtained after August 1st at www.CCCup.net, and will be included in the Skippers' Bags.

Skippers' Meeting: Social @ 1800 hours – Skippers' Meeting (conducted by Cape Charles Cup PRO John McCarthy) @ 1830 hours (sharp!) on Friday, August 12th at Bay Point Marina.

Courses: Saturday: Starting on the north side of the Thimble Shoal Channel approximately 2 miles north of "ILC" and finishing at the Cape Charles entrance buoy. Sunday: Starting in the vicinity of the Cape Charles entrance buoy and finishing off Buckroe. In the event of light air, the race committee may relocate the starting line closer to the first mark.

Classes: PHRF A, B, C, N (2HS-double headsails allowed) and N (1HS-single headsails only) with current PHRF rating. Cruising (single headsail only), open to monohull boats that do not have a valid PHRF rating and/or skippers that race only occasionally. Handicap adjustments will be made for previous multiple winners in Cruising Divisions. PHRF ratings may be obtained at www.phrfchesbay.org. Multihull, open to vessels designed for open-water voyages (no beach-launched vessels.) In Cruising and Multihull Divisions, ratings shall be assigned by the race organizers and shall not be subject to challenge. PHRF Nonspinnaker classes will receive an 18 sec/mi handicap bonus for Cape Charles Cup Trophy calculations. Classes with 3 or fewer entries may be combined for awards and starting.

Time: First Flag = 1000 hours Saturday and Sunday.

Rules: The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*. All monohulls must meet PHRF of the Chesapeake's Safety Equipment Requirements Category Ches Bay (4P), which can be downloaded at http://www.phrfchesbay.org/docs/PHRF_Equip_Regs_v2.pdf. All multihulls must meet equipment requirements described in 2016-2017 ISAF Offshore Special Regulations, which can be downloaded at [http://www.sailing.org/tools/documents/OSR2016-\[19851\].pdf](http://www.sailing.org/tools/documents/OSR2016-[19851].pdf).

Prizes: Daily class awards based on number of entries. Cape Charles Cup awards for the best total corrected time (Divisions with at least 13 entries). Saturday trophies awarded at the post-race party. Sunday and overall trophies awarded at the September 20th BBSA meeting at The Lagoon at Bay Point Marina.

If you do not have a dinghy, no problem, I will shuttle you around! Call me by the number above as I may or may not have my radio on. The bay is well protected and the sunset behind the carriers can be spectacular!

Cruise the Aegean Sea off the Greek Coast, by Dimitris Bampakos:

Dear fellow BBSA sailors,

I am writing to offer you a special deal for two training cruises that I have planned with ASA Flagship Sailing School (<http://www.flagshipsailing.com>), in the Aegean Sea, Greece this summer during the following dates:

- August 27 - September 03
- September 03-10

The cruises will start from Lavrion, Attica. Lavrion is located 30 miles south of Athens, close to Athens International airport (12 miles), and it has the advantage of an easy access to the island complexes of Cyclades and Argolic-Saronic gulf. The plan is to sail and visit a different island every day, stopping for swimming in protected bays and beaches. Most evenings will be docked ashore around 7:00pm.

Yacht

The yacht is a four cabin i434 Elan, in an excellent condition, with a dingy and outboard. It has all the inspection certifications for her seaworthiness and compliance with the European and Greek national safety regulations. Her safety equipment includes an EPIRB device and a Life Craft.

What is included?

- The charter of the yacht and its insurance
- A full time captain/ASA instructor
- All fuel and fresh water costs,
- Harbor fees, marina fees, local taxes
- Professional cleaning of the yacht, prior and at the end of the cruise
- All linens
- Provisioning for breakfast and lunch onboard plus snacks, bottled water, soft drinks and juices during the day as well as ice as needed

What is not included?

- Alcoholic beverages
- Evening meals on shore
- Personal insurance (it is highly recommended to purchase travel insurance prior to your arrival).

The price of the training cruise for a limited number of fellow BBSA/Patriot sailors is \$900 (a 50% discount). This special price does not include ASA certifications, which can be provided for an additional cost up to the 105 level.

Dimitris Bampakos' Sailing Resume:



Dimitris Bampakos is a Commander of the Greek navy. Most of his 26 years' service in the Navy was at sea as a captain, executive officer and deck officer on board frigates and fast patrol boats where he did more than 100,000 miles all over the world.

He first learned how to sail when he was a midshipman at the Greek Naval Academy. After his last command on board a warship in 2006, he started cruising and racing every summer in the Aegean and Ionian Seas where he did several thousand miles.

When serving in Virginia, from 2013 to 2016, he completed successfully all ASA certifications up to 108 offshore ocean passage level and became an ASA instructor up to 205 level. During this period, he also cruised and raced in Chesapeake Bay the Caribbean Sea and the Pacific Ocean.

He also holds a Master of Science degree in Electronic System Engineering and he has been teaching electronic warfare, radar and communications systems since 2000 at a post graduate level.
