Big thanks to John Blais, Vice-President, Southern Bay, of PHRF of the Chesapeake, for giving us a nice presentation on the PHRF of the Chesapeake organization at the February BBSA meeting; great information!

The 2017 Southern Bay Racing calendar is posted on the lower right hand corner of our homepage: www.broadbaysailing.org. The first big-boat races of the season are less than a month away as Little Creek starts their Wednesday Night Series on April 5th and Willoughby starts their series the next day. Registration for the Little Creek Series is April 1st. Willoughby Racers are having their registration in conjunction with the Nuts and Bolts Race Committee Workshop on March 25th at Sail Nauticus. Details are posted on our website and elsewhere in this Banter, but you don't want to miss this great workshop being taught by John McCarthy that will help you get through your turn this summer serving as the Race Committee.

Don't forget to finish up the following applications/renewals before the prep flag drops:

- **US Sailing** - as a member of BBSA, you get a discount on your membership: <https://www1.ussailing.org/membership/MPP/Default.aspx?ycid=108856C>
- **CBYRA** - for eligibility in their season long High Point competition; the Southern Bay has its own division (Region IV) for trophies. If you haven't done this before, give it a shot this year. There's no extra work as you're probably ALREADY racing in many of the area's CBYRA-sanctioned events (like BBSA's Cape Henry Cup, Cape Charles Cup, and Neptune's Atlantic Regatta); this just gives you the opportunity to win more trophies. Might as well, eh?? https://www.regattanetwork.com/membermgmt/CBYRA/membership_registration_start.php
- **PHRF of Chesapeake** for your Valid Rating - a necessary evil for racing (even if you are a Cruiser or a beer-can racer). <http://www.phrfchesbay.org/bin/renew.php>. Two-step process; fill out the electronic application/renewal form and then use the link below it to pay online. Both new applications AND renewals must use BOTH steps (you can't just pay for a renewal without submitting the renewal form). **Put BBSA in the blank for Primary Club** (so your voice will be heard through our PHRF delegate at their annual meeting). Put your (newly acquired?) CBYRA membership number in the blank for CBYRA so you can be eligible for the CBYRA High Point Championship.
- **CCV** - Their racing membership automatically enters you in all of their races for the season (except for Southern Bay Race Week); saves time, money, and headaches!! Worst case, join as a club member to get your copy of the annual racing bible (the CCV Racing Guide) to have information on every significant race in this area. <http://www.ccvracing.org/Membership/membership.html>. There is a link at the bottom to an online application.
- **Southern Bay Race Week** (June 2nd-4th) - why wait to get registered in the most competitive racing event of the year?? 3 days of racing (2 for the Cruising Fleet)... take advantage of the early bird entry fee and free beverage tickets! <http://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=3016>.

LCSA Races **start at 1800 in April and September**, and **start at 1830 May through August**.

The LCSA 2017 Sailing Instructions can be found on the BBSA website; and all known skippers have been emailed a copy. The 2017 sailing Instructions will be very similar to last years.

For 2017 we will continue with:

- NS2 Fleet will start first, followed by NS1/Spinnaker (second start);
- "Racing Credit" for RC duties;
- Set dates for each series, regardless of weather cancellations (25 scheduled races that includes five series of five races each);
- In addition to 3 awards for each fleet, continue to include a "Fleet Champion" award to the most successful racer in each fleet (based on top 13 scores).

The **2017 LCSA Kick-off Party and 2016 Awards Ceremony** will be on **1 April** from **2- 5 PM** at **Randy and Dani Goodman's House** in Virginia Beach.

Each guest (or couple) should bring an appetizer, hot dish or dessert. LCSA will provide beer, wine, soft drinks, water, paper products.

Mike Brannon will be smoking a turkey (that he raised) and bringing it, so the bar is set high.
