Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup, Submitted by Randy Goodman:

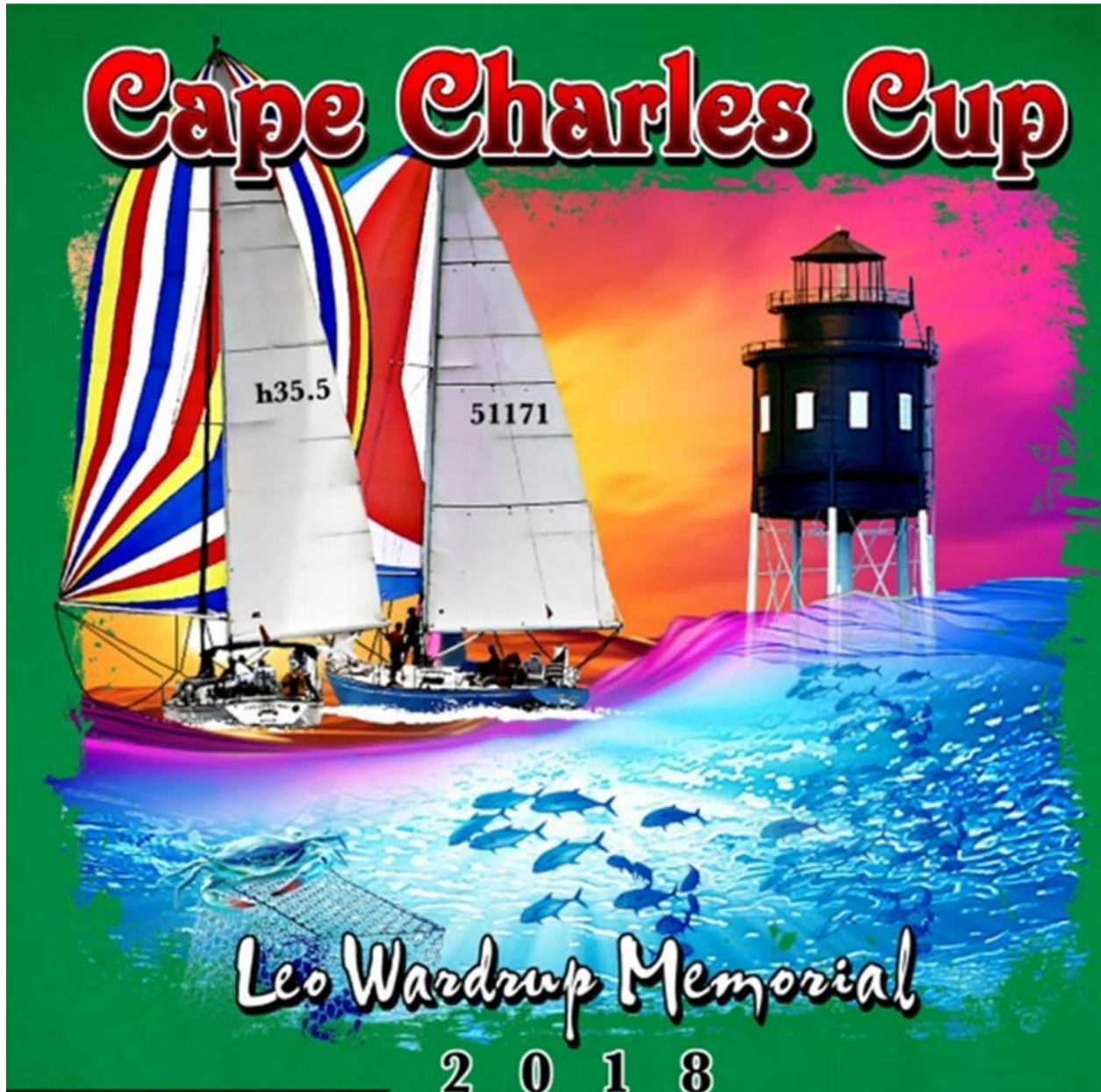
This year's Cape Charles Cup will be 11-12 August 2018.

New Cruising Class in the Cape Charles Cup, by Eric Brinsfield:

Some of you may have noticed that the Sailing Instructions for the Cape Charles Cup include a new cruising class listed as CRCA. Turns out this is a relatively new cruising class that was designed by the Chesapeake Racer Cruiser Association (<https://chesrca.weebly.com>). The targets boats that are rigged for cruising and for cruising captains that may want to use a cruising spinnaker along with other cruising equipment.

To share more information about the CRCA and the classes, I asked Jay Tyson, the president of the CRCA, to share some of the background. His story is shown below. We will see how it all works out this Saturday.

“In 2016 there were 4 races from Florida to Havana. Starts from Miami, Key West and Pensacola all had about 35 boats. St Petersburg put a cap of 75 and had a waiting list. Of the 75 boats that did the race 50 were cruisers. So, the question is how did they build such a strong fleet of cruisers? The answer is they spent the last 4 decades or so listening to what Cruisers that race want --which is very different from what the typical racer is looking for.

In the fall of winter of 2015, the CBYRA asked if I could bring some of that to the Chesapeake. This was the start of Chesapeake Racer Cruiser Association which is one of the fastest growing classes in the upper Chesapeake and has also started fleets in Lewes/Cape May, South Florida (race to Nassau, Key West and Havana) and now has a start in the Cape Charles Cup.

CRCA is different because we let cruisers race their boats the same way they cruise. All the gear stays aboard, cruising spinnakers are allowed but you can also choose to go “non-spin” with rating credit, if the weather or available crew makes this a safer/more comfortable call.

And the biggest difference is: we don’t use PHRF. PHRF cannot provide fair ratings for the wide variety of designs over a variety of conditions from drifters to blast reaches. In fact, we offer two rating systems. The Assigned Ratings are free and designed to provide “golf handicapping” that considers the experience of crew and skipper as well as race readiness of the boat and sails. These ratings are FREE.

For the more competitive programs, we use the Velocity Predication Program “ORRez Ratings”. These account for big heavy boats that are slow in light air, especially beating, but no so much on “power reaches” in open water with a bit of chop. Yes. The cost is \$100 with \$75 annual renewal, but the amazing power of these ratings has made believers out of the owners of CRCA boats.

And for the final difference, CRCA is set-up to allow owners to race anywhere from the Gulf of Mexico to New England with a single rating certificate and class rules. A great example of that is next June’s race from Cape May to New York City with a follow-up on Cruise/Racing in Long Island Sound.

Back River Cruise Sept 15-16, hosted by Joel and Donna Penne:

Back River has been a favorite anchorage of ours for years. It's only 9-10 miles from most Hampton Roads locations but isn't frequented by many sailors as an anchorage, perhaps because charts show less water depths than actually exist. It's protected in most wind directions depending on where you anchor with the exception of strong easterlies. You would think there's a lot of small power boat traffic but that happens mostly on hot summer weekends near Green 9.

If you've never been into Back River, just follow the markers from BR1 and stay mid channel as the depths range from 9-18'. Stay close to the shore at G9. The channel there is plenty deep but a bit narrow (you'd think you could almost reach out high-5 the people on the shore!). Just mind the marks until R16/G17.

Charts show shallow depths south of G17 but we've anchored there in 7' to get protection from SE through WSW. There's a large anchoring area north west of R16 until a bit west of G18. Just watch out for Messick's Point due north of G16.

There's a down home BBQ at Messick's Point called Bull Island BBQ which will be open for dinner or takeout until 8pm Saturday and for breakfast starting at 7am on Sunday. **You can tie your dinghy to the Poquoson Yacht Club dock to go to the restaurant.**

We'll be hosting Happy Hour on our boat, Seaquel, starting at 5pm and serving some Bull Island BBQ smoked wings. Bring your drinks and a nibble. If you get there early, we'll have our 2 person kayak and inflatable sailing dinghy in the water which you're welcome to try out.
