COMMODORE'S CORNER

Hello to everyone!

Well, we made it to June. We have gotten through part of a pandemic, murder hornets, and now protests that turned into riots in some areas. I am from Richmond, VA, and went to Virginia Commonwealth University. I am renovating my house there. My Richmond stomping grounds are in pretty bad shape. Thankfully my house is a few miles away from the protests. I have spent the last few months and especially the last week in touch with my high school and college friends. The last three months brought all of us more in touch. When I talk to my sorority sisters it is like nothing has changed in 30 years. My highlight of May was probably spending 45 minutes over at Cobb's Marina with my former sailing coach and friend, Scott Giering. Scott taught me everything I know about symmetrical spinnaker trim on the Tripp 38, which carried over to other boats. The few minutes we had together when he ducked out of the weather and into Norfolk on a delivery were priceless.

My world as Commodore has 6 groups of people I have continuously thought of throughout the last few months. Trust me when I say that this is a lot of people who sometimes want different things. To try to make this easy for all, I agreed to get on the same page with the other area clubs to open sailing. The clubs are now in alignment with each other, which will cut down on confusion as you move about doing different events at this time. We will all be using the same or similar waivers. Registration, waivers, protests, and anything else you would have done on paper will be electronic. Keelboat races for CCVR, HYC, and BBSA will be starting on June 17th. We have that date in place to give the attorney time to approve the waiver and get it up on the websites. This waiver puts liability on the boat owner/skipper to provide crew safety gear that now includes masks, gloves, and disinfectant for all crew members. All clubs will honor PHRF crew limits and will not require facemasks or gloves to be worn on race boats. Please keep in mind that any boat owner/skipper can require the crew to wear facemasks and gloves. It is a boat decision. John McCarthy has requested that race committees be reduced in number to have distance between everyone. To do this all clubs will use a start box and eliminate some prep flags. You will have to pay attention to the horns in all events. BBSA insurance covers all race committee members in our events. Race committee members are often from the other clubs or are more of a random group of people. Due to this, the board agreed that all BBSA event race committees must wear a face mask or covering like a Buff. If you don't want to wear a face mask, don't do race committee. Bob Magoon will be laying out the race committee structure before racing begins. For all of you small boat, Comet, Hampton One Design, or Beach Cat people who could be participating in a race like BBSA @ Norfolk Yacht on June 28th event or HYCs Sunfish Challenge, you will need to sign a waiver for those events from the hosting club. This waiver will be different from the keelboat waiver.

Well, that was a big paragraph.... I hope you read it all!

For you guys who have been wanting to sail in official keelboat events, be sure to look at the other club's calendars. CCVR will be having a modified Solstice Race on June 20th. Instead of going out into the ocean, you only have to sail in the harbor. That means you do not have to meet ocean safety requirements so all of you are eligible. June 28th is HYC's double-handed race. If you have been sailing short crewed over the last few months, this might be a great event to try out! People from around the area have asked me about Cape Henry Cup and Cape Charles Cup. Cape Henry is still TBD. We may try to get that in the schedule. Cape Charles Cup will happen under a modified format. This event does raise funds for the middle school kid's program at Sail Nauticus. Bob Magoon, Scott Almond, and Jay

Thompson are working on out and back mid-distance courses that will be suitable for our cruising fleet. I hope that everyone gets out on the water and participates in 2 great days of sailing!

For you guys who love our membership meetings, we still can't do that. I want to do that, but we can't do that. We will have a membership meeting as soon as we are allowed to have the entire membership in one place not standing 6 ft apart from each other. I look forward to the day I get to see your smiling faces again! Until then, enjoy your June. I will look forward to seeing many of you out on the water over the upcoming weeks.

The following is an update Andy Spittler provided the LCSA Racers following the BBSA Board last Thursday evening:

The Board met "to discuss the way forward, with the goal of opening up racing and being consistent with what the other clubs in the Southern Bay are doing. The plan is for us to wait until the Commonwealth opens up Phase 2. If there are no changes to the current Phase opening schedule, we

should be able to start racing 17 June 2020. Also discussed were practices that will mitigate risk for the Racers and Race Committee (RC).

The following is a summary of COVID-19 mitigation actions that BBSA and LCSA will undertake to keep us safe and sailing.

- 1) To reduce the number of people it takes to run a RC, BBSA will provide an automatic sailboat race starter system to LCSA. This is a one button device with built in horn, that will automate the starting sequence. Most of the flags will go away.
- 2) All skippers will sign a new waiver that will be consistent with other the sailing clubs in the Southern Bay. It is currently being vetted by the Lawyers.
- 3) Vessels will be required to carry on board masks or buffs (look it up, I had to), gloves, and hand sanitizer and related items; which shall be made available to the crew that wants it.
- 4) Maximum crew limits are determined by PHRF.

Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions will be updated as soon as I get written guidance. Once I have those documents updated, we hope to hold some training to answer any questions on the new requirements and how to operate and maintain the signal box before we go racing.” Thank you, Andy!

HRBT construction Plans

6-4-20

I wanted to share some Information with the Club we have received from HRCP (Hampton Roads Construction Partners) on the new Tunnel Project.

In February this year, Curt Hauger, Rob Duncan and I met with their Public relations delegation to gather Information on the project as it relates to our Boating activities. You can currently see some activity in their lay down (Staging) area adjacent to Rebel Marina and on the South Tunnel Island Ft. Wool area. There will be docking structures by the old pier structure off the Willoughby North channel and directly outside the Breakwater opening to Rebel and Willoughby Harbor Marina.

Inside Willoughby Bay, off the I-64 Trestle will be a Quarantine area for storage of Large Marine equipment, Cranes, Barges and such. It will be a row of Large pilings and a marked area to keep marine traffic outside of this storage area. Equipment will be stored here mostly in Bad weather events for protection and will intrude in our Willoughby Racers normal upwind course to some extent.

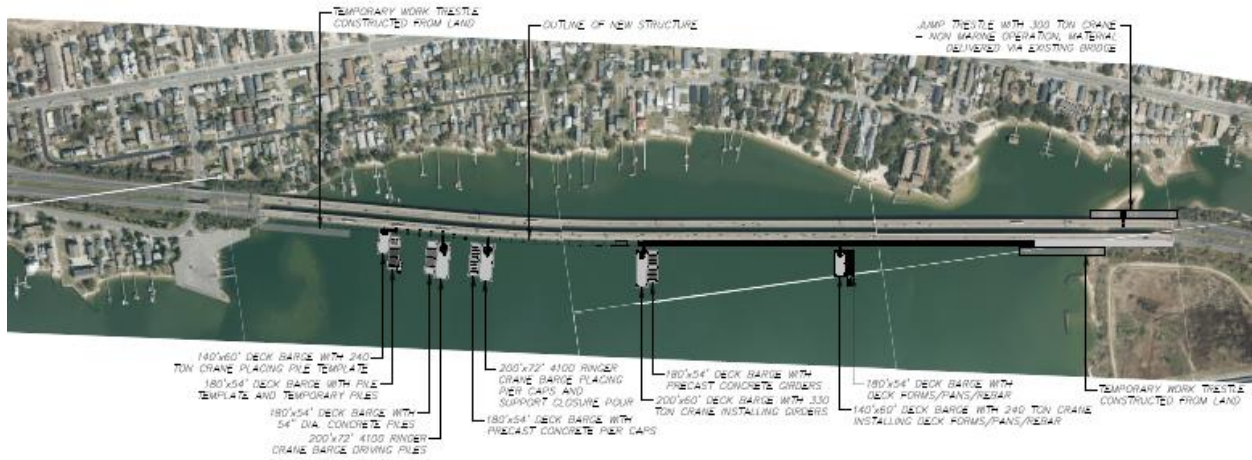
Later this summer and Fall you can expect to see growing traffic around the two Marinas from these construction activities. This project is estimated to take 7 Years and will likely benefit from some well needed Maintenance at least on the North Channel leaving Willoughby Bay.

This is currently the Largest Construction Project in our State at \$3.3 BI and will provide some interesting (If you like that stuff) Construction Equipment for Boring the Tunnels, and they are currently using Border Collies to keep nesting Birds from doing so in the Construction areas.

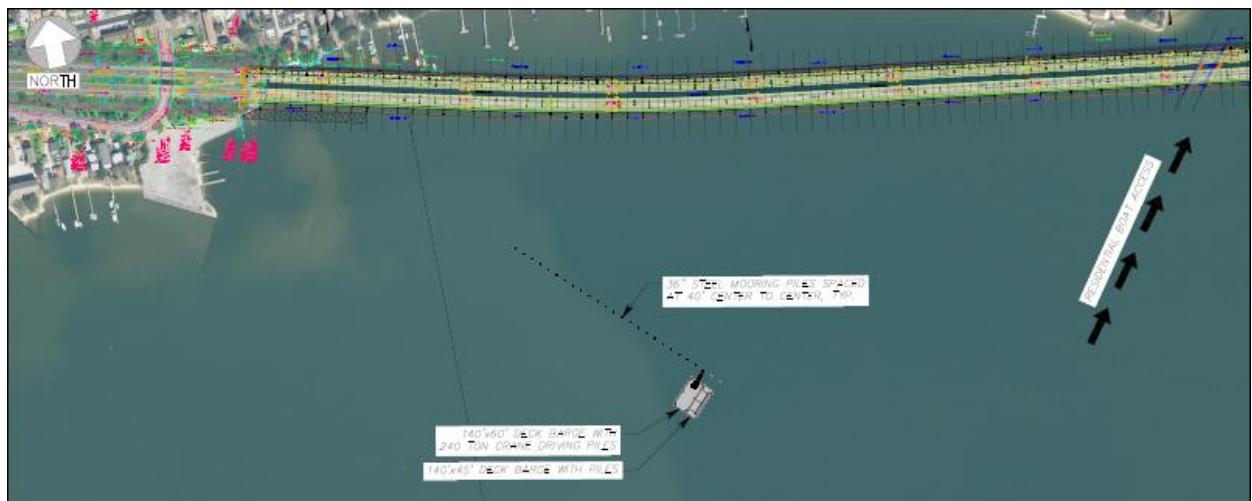
Curt and I will be in contact with their representatives throughout the Project and anything we need specifically can be obtained easily. So far, they are a good group to work with.

Master, Coastal Vessels 50 tons (In Continuum)

Kiptopeke State Park, 19-21 June

“Ahoy, All Condo Cruisers, Want-to-be-s, and even Club dock walkers!

We are planning for and hoping to be able to have our first real cruise of the year on June 19-21st to Kiptopeke State Park. Note that having it is totally dependent upon our State Governor being able to lift the statewide ban against congregating by June 10th as currently planned.,

After these past weeks of virus anxiety that has resulted in most of us feeling too cooped up and needing a medical injection of “ON BOARD” time, we want to plan to provide that much needed “fix” by getting together and have some well needed fun.

Beginning on Friday afternoon- April and I will sail over to Kiptopeke State Park – and anchor off the Concrete Ships. Our April Wind will act as the mother ship for the cruise and weather permitting, others are welcome to raft off of us for afternoon cocktails until nightfall.

On Saturday, we will be taking the party to the nearby beach so bring your dink and a reliable motor (or good strong arms) as there is often a current running N/S through the passage. Bring sunning chairs, umbrella’s coolers, etc. and at 5:00 (Somewhere) we will begin to salute Poseidon and will warm up our small grill. I suggest you try to bring a small grill to the beach if you can along with your drink(s) of choice and snacks for the afternoon as well as dinner fixing to share. The plan is for all of us to enjoy being out on the water and together after such a long stressful confinement. Let’s play at being beach bums and bunnies and plan to toast each other and to our good lives as we watch the sun sets to the West over the concrete ships. If by chance the weather is not conducive to beach time together the party on Saturday can join April and me aboard S/Y April Wind....just bring your own libations and dinner fixings, including enough to share as I will be grilling off the stern unless the rain gods are mad at us.

Sunday hopefully will offer more of the same fun until it is time to depart back to HYC. April Wind may even be serving Mimosas if you would like to come aboard for a last toast before departing. We will plan to stay awhile and ultimately hoist anchor about 1:30 PM depending upon the weather.

Where: Kiptopeke State Park – Anchorage inside of the Concrete ships. Approximately, 21 NM from HYC. Course approximate 058 from the High Range marker approximately 1 NM offshore of Fort Monroe’s channel side beach. If you wish to come join us by land yacht, Kiptopeke State Park entrance is only a few miles North of the Eastern end of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge tunnel roadway termination onto the Eastern Shore.

Why There: This is a great anchorage with good holding assuming the use of the right weight anchor/chain; there is plenty of room for all of us to anchor overnight and the area is extremely peaceful. It offers a wonderful environment and frequently many species of seabirds can be seen all around you. The park offers nature walks which are currently open, and playgrounds and “facilities” ashore if they are reopened by then, as well to enjoy.

Why: We are joining together to bring in the new cruising season, and to celebrate (hopefully) the passing of the contagiousness currently confining us all.

What to Bring: April and I will be providing some light snacks and water, and ice to share in one cooler but we will definitely need more than one cooler for everyone to have cool drinks on the beach over a few hours of time. So, bring a cooler filled with ice if you can.

We suggest that you plan to bring your drink of preference, beach mats or blankets along with appropriate sunscreen, some yummy appetizers to share and what you would like to grill and eat for dinner. If you have portable deck chairs or small cocktail tables, they might really come in handy. Heck, if you still have those old winter socks to burn, bring them along and we will add them to the coals after all food has been grilled!
