Useful RC Information

I thought it would be useful to incorporate information that has been included in the various training sessions for race committee and race management in my monthly Banter sections.

How long should a starting line be? The rule of thumb is that it should be 1 to 1.5 times the length of the largest fleet. I calculated that based on an average boat length of 35 feet and 8 boats in a typical LCSA fleet and came up with 420 feet. If you don't carry a range finder or use the GPS MOB function to show the distance, my best suggestion is to note that the docks at Bay Point are about 400 feet long. When I have RC duty, I calibrate my eyeball as I walk onto the dock to get a vision of 400 feet.

Where's the RC Equipment? The Race Committee Equipment (to include an iStart automated starting box, signal flags, course board, orange drop mark and anchor, and RC Bag) will be located in a locked dock box located at Bay Point Marina, on A Dock, in front of Slip A8. Those serving as RC should return the equipment immediately after the race that they served as RC. After returning the equipment they should email or text the LCSA Coordinator that the equipment is returned and they should identify any discrepancies or shortfalls in the RC equipment. Combination to the Dock Box will be provided separately.

How is the RC boat scored? Boats not racing in order to serve as Race Committee (RC) shall be scored for that race as described in the applicable SI.

What if I can't serve as RC when scheduled? Typically, a boat scheduled to be RC shall either serve as scheduled or find her own replacement. When finding a replacement, the RC will notify the LCSA or Willoughby Coordinator of the change prior to the race start. If she is unable to either serve or find a replacement, she will be penalized in accordance with the SI.

Other Racing News

Rob Williams has built a new J mark and should have it installed before the racing season starts. Yea!! It's been really challenging to configure interesting courses that most boats can complete without it.

We've received USCG approval for the LCSA and Willoughby weekly races and the Cape Henry Cup. Kudos to the CG for their responsiveness.

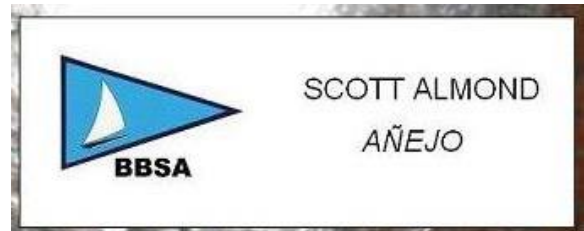

Member Spotlight: Rob Williams

What is your name& short blub about you? What roles do you have in BBSA & local sailing?

Robert "Rob" Williams, newlywed to Jennifer "Jen" Williams as of 3/21/21. I am the incoming Treasurer for BBSA and PHRF rater for BBSA, NNSA, OPCYC and NYCC. Certified by US Sailing as a Club Race Officer and Sail Measurer.

Do you have one or more boats/type/name?

Jen & I own S/V Set Free a 2000 Hunter 460. Previously owned a Beneteau First 41s5 but lost it in 2014 due to damage from Hurricane Gonzalo in St Martin.

How old are you? How long have you been sailing? How did you get interested in sailing?

Age really? 64. Started sailing in 1988 while stationed in Newport RI with USN. I first got interested in sailing in 1978 while in St Croix onboard a Navy Destroyer. I saw a cruising sailboat anchored while I was stuck on duty onboard the ship. I longed for the freedom that sailing would allow. I should also mention that I was 18 and one of the anchored sailboats had a nude lady onboard. I thought, if that's what sailing was about, I'd love sailing.

What do you enjoy most about BBSA? Racing, cruising, social events, training

BBSA has gotten me sailing a lot more than when I was not involved in a sailing association. I love racing with LCSA on Wednesday's and distance races on the weekends. I have made great friends on my crew and with those we have compete against. I enjoy the membership meetings and the training but most of all, it's the people I've met and the friends I've made through BBSA.

How do you prep for a race, what is key in winning?

Interesting question since I am still learning but I'll give my two cents. First, everyone on our crew is valuable and I encourage everyone to share how we can do better. We end each race with a "hot washup." Each crew member shares what we need to improve on and what we did well. I think it's more about improving than winning; if we improve as a team each week the winning will come. Second, the boat must be in top shape, hull cleaned, sails good, etc. Lastly, I want us to have fun because if our crew is having fun, they will continue to sail with me even when I am an asshole.

What sailing social media sites do you follow and/or find helpful?

I mainly follow Facebook Sailing Groups, YouTube videos on sailboat racing, Sailing Anarchy and Cruiser Forums. I spend way too much time researching the racing Rules of Sailing and searching Google on how to be more successful racing. Then I send sail trim and racing tactics to my crew so we stay engaged and can be on the same page when we sail.

What are some good sailing related books or movies you can suggest?

If you race and haven't read Dave Perry's 100 Best Racing Rules of Sailing Quizzes, I strongly recommend it. It's really 100 different scenarios you will see while racing and which rule applies. Everyone should watch SailGP, fast paced and probably the future of sailboat racing.

How do you prep the boat for the season?

Clean the hull, fuel the tank, tweak the rig and go for it.

What do you think about when looking for new sails?

How can I get new sails for less money. How can I buy a new sails without Jen knowing the cost until it's too late to back out.

Can you explain the key differences between PHRF and ORC ratings?

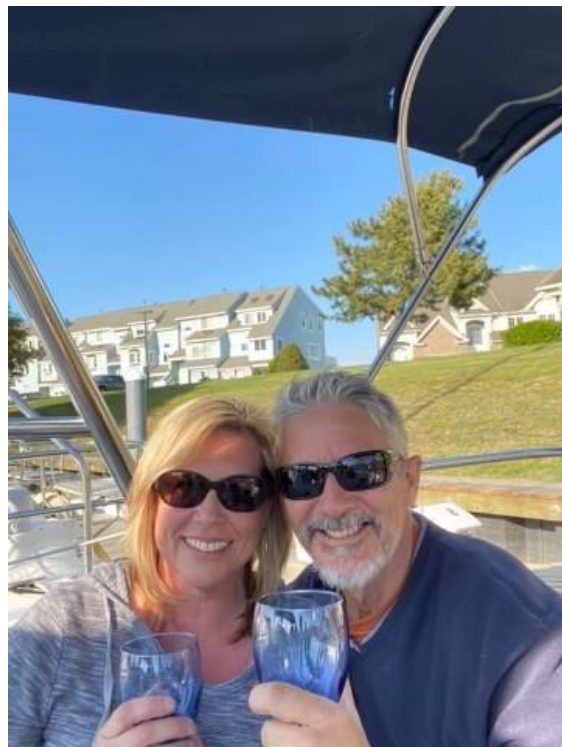
PHRF is a basic handicap rating system, it is inexpensive and very easy for race scorers to use. ORC & ORA are complicated math-based rating systems, they are more accurate, more expensive and harder for race scorers to use because there are so many winds variables. PHRF does a good job leveling the playing field over a long series. ORC is better at leveling the playing field for distance races.

What is the best music to listen to while heading to a race?

What goals do you have for the upcoming season?

Have fun and continue to improve sailing abilities. As for racing Set Free hopes to finish in 1st or 2nd place overall in 2023 LCSA PHRF Non-spin fleet and in the 2023 Southern Bay Distance Series.
