The second day was a race from Seaford to York River Yacht Haven on Sarah's Creek off the York River. There was evening socializing involving the YRYC pool (go figure).. The race back to Hampton on the third day finished at the Fort Monroe seawall, where the SBRW Distance Race finishes today. Continued today, is the practice of each racing day bearing a name. SBRW Day 1 is named for southern Bay notable, *Malcolm Davis*. Day 2 is named *Casemate*, and Day 3, *Old Point -Black Beard*. So, two places and two personalities are featured in the names. This year Malcolm Davis' grandson, Bryan Davis will be racing his C&C 25, *BEESWAX*, in the PHRF Division. To date, no one has stepped forward as a blood relative of Black Beard.
