CAPE CHARLES CUP: Racing was abandoned on Sunday due to lack of wind. Therefore, the Saturday Yellow Jersey Winners will likely be confirmed as the 2021 Cape Charles Cup winners: PHRF- MYRAGE, CRCA- DIABLO, CRUISING - WIND RUSH II. It was hot and there was not much racing air for this southern Bay favorite summer event. These were conditions not unfamiliar to participants in the mid-August pair of races separated by a party on the Eastern Shore. Finishing the race before the expiration of the time limit and/or a decent racing breeze was easier said than done for the 18th rendition of the CCCup. However, the race on Saturday, a distance of almost 16nm, was doable for 31 of the 65 boats that started the race. The Multihull fleet had 2 boats start, but neither finish. The schooner *Virginia* sailed exhibition at the event. This event is named in memory of founder Leo Wardrup – Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup – and administered by Broad Bay Sailing Association (BBSA). Racers and cruisers alike had a memorable time racing to and partying at Cape Charles and the return of the "real" Cape Charles Cup regatta format. Kudos to all who participated and those who handled the logistics!

SOUTHERN BAY JUNIOR RACING NATIONAL CHAMPIONS! Racing in RS 21s, the Hampton Yacht Club Junior Keelboat Team, comprised of Kyle Pfrang (helmsman), Pierce Brindley, Parker Moore, and Kevin Li, are the US SAILING NATIONAL JUNIOR KEELBOAT CHAMPIONS. This particular championship for junior sailors aged 13-18, is set up for three championship fleets – singlehanded, doublehanded, and, the one the HYC team captured, quadruplehanded. They raced 10 other teams and finished in first one point ahead of the second place team this past week in Marblehead, Massachusetts, winning the 100th Sears Cup. Kneen's reflections on the team's Fastnet success: "When you get everything in the right place, with the right people, in the right conditions... we had four, five, or six hours of that, between the Scillies and the Lizard, when we had 25 knots of breeze and the boat – our so-called 'caravan' – was flying along at 20 plus knots. In moments like that, all the rest of it you forget very quickly, when you're beating in 30 knots of wind and vomiting over the back and wondering why you're there.
