CCVR FALL SERIES Day 2 / Race 3. Twenty Three (23) southern Bay racers handled the Fall Series middle distance race with aplomb Sunday. The fleet faced cantankerous current and wind that threatened to lighten toward the end of the race.

This race was a lead up to the **CCVR Fall Series Day 3 / Races 4&5 this coming Sunday- Oct 10th**. Day 3 will be the Series Finale as well as the final 2021 CCVR event that counts in the prestigious CCV HIGH POINT CHAMPIONSHIP. Yesterday's race (#3), in addition to being a factor in the CCVR High Point, also figured large in the Southern Bay Distance Race Series.

Coming soon to the southern Bay – J/111 WORLDS. The 2021 J/111 World Championship, (Oct 18-24), as with most such events, has been scheduled for a while. Host Hampton has been "getting ready" since before the beginning of 2021. Now it is

nitty-gritty time. Slipway bottoms have been dredged and slips made available (the competitors will all stay at HYC, and so will all the support / RC boats). The regatta central tent will be pitched on the north area of the grounds, and awards have been ordered. Meanwhile, the competitors are getting ready too. At Screwpile Lighthouse Challenge weekend before last, 4 of the J/111s, all of whom will be at the Worlds, tangled for two days, and dominated the ORC Division, taking the top 4 places overall and in 4 of the 5 races. **Southern Bay J/111, SITELLA (skipper Ian Hill) finished 2nd overall at Screwpile.** Ian Hill sails out of HYC and resides in Chesapeake, Virginia. *Ramrod* (skipper Rod Jabin, AYC) won the 11 boat division. J/111s homeported in Maryland (2), Virginia, New York, Connecticut, Cleveland (2) and California will be in Hampton for the Worlds.
