And, there is a Cruising class for non-PHRF racers. This is a great day long race in the southern Bay. The start area is off Buckroe Beach and the finish area is off Fort Monroe . The main course takes racers out the Chesapeake Channel entrance to the CBBT, rounds a mark off Lynnhaven Inlet, and returns to Fort Monroe via the Thimble Shoal Channel opening (27.4 nm).
