**On this Christmas evening**, when the holiday celebration has calmed and you are having your mid-night snack, think about the scene on the Delaware River in 1776. George Washington, at dusk, had loaded his army into open boats to cross the Delaware to take on the Hessian and British troops in New Jersey. Fighting snow, sleet, and howling wind, the crossing was completed at 3AM (December 26). The rest is history.

**2008 New Year's Madness Race, January 1, 2008.** Start at Hampton Yacht Club and finish at Old Point Comfort Yacht Club. This is a pursuit (staggered start) race - starting times begin at 1130.
