Final Day of CCV SPRING SERIES (Races #4 and #5), this coming Sunday, May 4. Plans are for two drop mark course races in Hampton Roads Harbor. The first warning scheduled for 1030. There will be starts for each PHRF Spinnaker Fleet, PHRF Non-Spin, and a Cruising Fleet. Valid 2008 PHRF ratings are required for all PHRF racers. OPEN TO ALL. Boats with CCV Racing Memberships are automatically entered; all other racers must submit an entry form and fees no later than the day before race day. Double the Distance, Double the Fun! CCV Spring Series Race #3 came off without a hitch yesterday and this morning all the top finishers are "sittin' pretty", both in the CCV Spring Series Standings and in the 2008 Chesapeake Bay Distance Racing Series. The middle distance race (15.45 nm for A and B fleets and 11.73 miles for the C and Non-Spin fleets) counts in both of those series. A downwind start, starboard roundings, and navigational puzzles including current and wind patterns provided the racers with "something different" from the usual drop mark format. CCV intends to use the 3rd race of their Fall Series for a similar kind of "brain shake". US Sailors Warm-Up Well for August Olympics: From southern Bay expatriate, **Derby Anderson**, comes word of former ODU All American, **Anna Tunnicliffe** and some of her mates who won silver medals at the

French Olympic Sailing Week in Hyeres. Derby's report said, "Anna Tunnicliffe clung to second place in the Laser Radial class, with the 2007 International Sailing Federation's Rolex World Sailor of the Year nominee Evi Van Ecker of Belgium only one point behind in the final standings. Over the nine-race series, Tunnicliffe's worst score was only an eleventh. She had the lowest dropped score in the 78-boat class. Sarah Blanck of Australia earned first place and finished all but one race in the top four." The American performances at Hyeres are reason for optimism regarding the Olympics in China in Qingdao.
