VIRGINIA H WINS CAPE HENRY CUP: Thirty-five race boats put a perfect day to perfect use Saturday, in the CAPE HENRY CUP, organized by Broad Bay Sailing Association. Sailed in the vicinity of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel, the tail of the Horseshoe and Thimble Shoal, this is a local favorite event and the second race of the Chesapeake Bay Distance Race Series. The PHRF A boats' course was 27.40 nautical miles and all other fleets' courses were 20.30 nautical miles. The last boat crossed the finish line shortly after 1600. Perhaps emulating Big Brown in the Kentucky Derby (he started in the far outside spot), *Meridian 2*, in the last fleet to start, was the first boat of all contenders to the finish line. It's Back!!! THE DOWN THE BAY RACE for the VIRGINIA CRUISING CUP! Hampton Yacht Club and the Storm Trysail Club (Annapolis) have gotten together to revive the annual <u>Down the Bay Race next year</u>. Organizers have settled on the 2009 starting date. The race will start on May 22, 2009, the Friday before Memorial Day. The course is non-stop, through the night (and maybe parts of the following day) from Annapolis to Hampton. This race, which began in 1935, but went into hiatus after 1999, has plenty of DTB veterans still active on our race courses. Organizers say that the 2009 re-opening will be the 60th race for the Virginia Cruising Cup - folks didn't do much racing during World War II. Watch *SBRNYCU* for details as available. And, mark your calendar. Our racing brethren in the northern Bay waters may see this event as a great way to "come south" for Southern Bay Race Week 2009.

PHRF - bit: Remember, if your PHRF rating includes a **credit for using a roller furler, e.g. RFA or RFB**, you must use the roller furler in your sail plan when racing. All the tentacles that apply to that credit always apply to you. You do not get to go back and forth, sometimes using a headsail foil or hanks. The RF credit - you bought it, you own it, and you must use it!
