SBRW BOAT OF THE WEEK - TENACIOUS. Carl and Scott Gitchell, from Annapolis, Maryland, swept the J/105 Fleet with 7 bullets to win the Black Seal Cup at SOUTHERN BAY RACE WEEK this past weekend. No other boat ran the table in the 10 fleet regatta. However, Ben Weeks' J/29, Rumble, sailing in PHRF B1, came through the regatta with only one blemish (Lance Ryley's Elliott 770, RockIt, won Race #6) and Richard Winters won all but one race; he suffered a second in Race #1, in It's White, a J/22 sailing in PHRF C. The regatta experienced every kind of weather the southern Bay has to offer. Light air on Friday made getting in two races a significant accomplishment. On Saturday, the winds blew holy Hannah, and the day turned into an official gear buster. The fleets got in three races in conditions where gusts topped out at 31 knots. On Sunday the fleet was faced with, say it isn't so, moderate and pleasant (a fairly steady 8-9 knots out of the SouthWest) and got in 2 races, except for the PHRF C fleet, which was unable to finish the last race of the day. This year SBRW presented a Boat of the Day award (one on each course each day) to a boat selected for it's overall performance. The awards were sponsored by three area sailmakers - Winters, North, and Doyle - and the recipients were selected by the courses race committees.
