Shearwater finished 2nd in her 13 boat class and 2nd overall in the 43 boat Cruiser Division. Final results were delayed until a correction to the computer database could be made. Thanks to the diligent work of event chairman Larry Bryant and others, the corrections have been made and results published. Boo Nasty won the Spinnaker C fleet by the greatest elapsed time and, thereby, the Hanbury Trophy. All the Spinnaker and the Non-Spinnaker 1 fleets sailed a course a little over 8 nautical miles; everyone else went 6.26 nm.
