13th ANNUAL HOSPICE TURKEY SHOOT REGATTA is counting down to this coming weekend, October 10-12 - on the Rappahannock River off Carter's Creek and the Corrottoman River. This is a full blown regatta, including welcoming Happy Hour with live music on Friday, drop mark courses on Saturday, and a pursuit race (up the river and back) on Sunday, pre-race breakfasting and post-race eating, drinking and socializing, and, of course, grand awards. More than 106 boats are already entered and more are expected this week. Winner of the Lightning Division (PHRF racing) will be invited to compete in the National Hospice Regatta in Spring of 2009. This is a great event with a nice post-race party and awards at the OPCYC clubhouse on Ft
