Of special interest to southern Bay racers: **Peter Hunter's** Thompson 30, *Wairere*, (Kill Devil Hill, NC) took a 1st and a 2nd in the last two of 10 races to move up to 2nd overall in PHRF-1. **Jeremiah Dull**, who at one time crewed on **Dave Taylor's** previous boat, *Midmorning Buzz*, was part of the *Wairere* crew at KWRW. Another, Tarheel State boat, **Ken Womack's** Beneteau 36.7, *Blueprint* (Oriental, NC) finished 4th overall in PHRF-2. In the J/105 fleet, **Carl Gitchell's** *Tenacious* (winner of the SBRW Black Seal Cup in 2008) finished 5th overall among 13 J/105s racing. **Worth Harris'** *Rum at Six* (Beaufort, NC) was 7th overall. Southern Bay-ites, **Pat Hillard** and his wife are on a year long cruise and happened upon Key West Race Week on opening day. They reported that they "... had to tack twice to stay off the race course..." but, that it was a lovely sight. Pat confirmed it was blowing like stink, 20-30 knots, at one point later in the week.
