Chessie giveth and Chessie taketh away... for the IDA LEWIS, Chessie was most generous in her giving! For the 3 days of clinics and the first 2 of the 3 racing days, Chessie was generous indeed. The US SAILING Junior Women's Doublehanded National Championship Regatta had beautiful racing conditions right up to the very last day of the 6 day event. The competitors had 7 terrific races over the first two days of actual racing (3 races are required for the event to stand as an official championship) - spinnakers flew downwind, crew leaned out on their traps and skippers drove their 420s to the brink. The racing was excellent for the sailors themselves as well as for those watching. On Saturday, the last day of the regatta, in spite of wind dances and promises of sacrifices, there just was no way that there was sufficient sustained wind (4+kts required) to get in additional races. Mid-way through the one race that actually was started, Chessie packed up her wind bag and left for the day. No problem, the 74 racers headed in at mid-afternoon, packed their boats and gear, put on their awards dinner and ceremony finery, and proceeded to wrap-up a grand championship event. Southern Chesapeake Leukemia Cup Regatta. The 11th Annual Southern Bay Leukemia Cup Regatta, hosted by Fishing Bay Yacht Club and Stingray Harbour Yacht Club, was held at FBYC this past weekend, with a record 85 boats entered and 72 actually sailing. The fleet divided itself almost evenly between 35 PHRF and One-Design racers and 37 "Cruising Class" competitors. The entire effort raised more than \$150,000 - they are still counting - to support the Virginia Chapter of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.
