BLACK WIDOW and WHISPER take 2009 CAPE CHARLES CUP titles: Leo Wardrup's Black Widow won the 40 boat PHRF Division of this growing southern Bay event and Larry Bryant's Whisper took home the Cruising Division trophy. A total of 88 boats (up 8 from last year's entries) took up the challenge of the two day regatta. On Saturday, expecting predicted 8-12 foot waves over the course from Little Creek to Cape Charles on the Virginia Eastern Shore, the fleet set out in fickle wind conditions that built to 17 knots at the finish. Most of the fleet had the patience to wait for the breeze and all of those boats (80%) finished in plenty of time to beat the impending thunderstorms and to spruce up for the post-race festivities at Bay Creek Resort Marina at Cape Charles. A grand party, buffet dinner, and two bands played well into the night. Sunday morning proved to be the time of Hurricane Bill's impact; the storm, which had moved off-shore and never did send the much publicized "huge waves", sucked all the wind with it and by mid-afternoon, when it was obvious that the great majority of the fleet could not make the time limit, Sunday's race was abandoned.
