SAFFIR-SIMPSON SCALE drops storm surge and flooding as measures. The Saffir-Simpson Hurricane <u>Wind</u> Scale is the new name. The folks that know about these things have concluded, rightfully so, that storm surge cannot be reliably predicted based on the Category assigned a hurricane. Since storm surge is determined in significant part by water depth, coastline configuration, and shape of the storm, etc. and not necessarily by the wind speeds of the storm, it makes better sense to drop surge from the Saffir-Simpson and treat it (surge) as a separate issue. The National Hurricane Center sites as an example Hurricane Ike. Based on wind speeds Ike was a Cat 2, but carried a surge of a Cat 5 (15 - 20 feet) when it made landfall.
