**John Bertrand wins Laser Masters.** John Bertrand, a name familiar to America's Cup aficionados, captured the <u>2009 Chesapeake Bay Laser Masters Championship</u> hosted by Fishing Bay Yacht Club this past weekend. Twenty-five (25) Laser sailors, all over the age of 35, competed over the two days. Bertrand won all six races to sweep the event. Two southern Bay racers, **James Jacob** (FBYC - 2nd) and **Henry Amthor** (HYC-7th), finished in the top 10 overall. Jon Deutsch was event coordinator.

Schooners Galore! Thirty-two (32) schooners, led in the water by *Pride of Baltimore II* and *Virginia*, braved the winter-like weather and completed the 20th Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race Friday. Conditions at the start of the race included 20-25 knot winds with gusts to 30 and air temperature in the 40s. Oh, and don't forget the rain. Race official Bill Mellen said that most of the schooners reported winds of 15-20 for the second half of the race and none "...reported damage and all crew members arrived in Portsmouth in one piece." The *Pride of Baltimore* grabbed line honors, making the 127 mile trip in 14:03:30, finishing at 3:43:20 Friday morning. The *Virginia* finished at 4:29:00 Friday with an elapsed time of 14:49:00. *Pride* and *Virginia* corrected to 2nd and 3rd place respectively in the AA Class. *Lady Maryland* (Rich Hilliman, Baltimore, MD) was the winner of the AA Class. There were 15 entered schooners that did not start.

KUDOS are in order for **SpinSheet Magazine** for publishing in the October edition the official program for the Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race which also included info on the City of Portsmouth's Schooner Days festivities.

Goin' to Rochester in 2010 - When the Hospice Regattas National Championship is sailed this coming spring at Rochester Yacht Club in New York, there will be three (3) teams from the southern Bay and beyond. Going from the Greater Hampton Roads Hospice Regatta will be Leroi Lissenden (Richmond, VA) and the Voodoo 2 team. Invited from the Albemarle Hospice Regatta will be Chris Elliott (Edenton, NC), and the Matador team. The latest addition to the southern Bay contingent will be Robert Fleck (Hardyville, VA), Horizon, who won the Hospice Turkey Shoot Regatta Lightning fleet earlier this month.

**Annapolis Sail Boat Show** officials have released a very favorable preliminary attendance report - one of the best attended ever, maybe in the top 3. There were some great boats there and plenty of jazzy gear. All southern Bay racers' reports say the docks were plenty full of sailors, local as well as international.

THE 505s ARE COMING! Hampton Yacht Club will host the International 505 East Coast Championships in September, 2010. Even sooner than that, the 505 Fleet 8 Championship Regatta will be at Hampton, November 14-15, 2009. The International 505 is the high performance, 2-man dinghy that is almost as much fun to watch as it is to sail. Earlier this month, Hamptonian Henry Amthor and crew finished 2nd in class at the Heineken High Performance Dinghy Open in Rye, New York. Another Hampton 505 racer who will be competing, Tyler Moore, finished 5th in the 505 Worlds in August.

To no one's surprise, **Ric and Sharon Bauer**'s lovingly restored Hinckley 41, *Desperado*, was deemed the prettiest girl at the dance recently. The skippers of the 114 boats sailing at the Hospice Turkey Shoot Regatta voted *Desperado* the Most Beautiful Boat in the regatta. And, the winner of the 11 boat Lightning (racing) Fleet was Robert Fleck in his S2 7.9, *Horizon*. **Frank Murphy** in *Last Boat III*, a Morgan 24, won the Flying Cloud Division.
