Mark Wheeler, sailed as navigator on IRC 1 fleet *Vela Veloce* (6th place), and southern Bay expatriate Steven Hunt was tactician on the 3rd place Melges 24, WTF (Alan Field, Marina del Rey, CA) in that 21 boat fleet.
