61st DOWN THE BAY RACE. Thirty-one (31) boats left Annapolis Friday in search of Hampton - 24 found it. Thirty-six (36) boats entered the DOWN THE BAY RACE, and 31 started at Annapolis in light air on Friday morning, sailed into 20 knots on the nose most of the night and struggled through moderate to dying breezes late Saturday. It was not an easy race - 24 boats finished. The first boat to finish (Meridian 2, Farr 36, Sledd Shelhorse) made the trip in 23 hours, 6 minutes, and 18 seconds, and to her go Line Honors. The last boat to finish (Coeur d' Alene, Crealock 37, Hank Giffin) took 44 hours, 5 minutes, and 41 seconds. and to her go DTB finisher braggin' rights. Like all the finishers, both Coeur d' Alene and Meridian skippers and crew proved to have ample sand and grit. The DTB stories will live and grow forever. It is why racers must race DOWN THE BAY.
