SBRNYCU is an independent weekly publication of southern Chesapeake Bay racing happenings. Founded in April, 2000.

Key West Race Week offered an assortment of conditions, most of them good, and plenty of big names, including Russell Coutts. The only southern Bay boat racing in Key West was **Travis Weisleder's Lucky Dog**. Travis and crew finished 8th overall in the 14 boat J105 fleet. Southern Bay racer **Mark Wheeler** was navigator on the winner of the 5 boat IRC-1 fleet, *Vela Veloce*, who snatched the overall top spot in the last race of the event on Friday. There were 136 boats entered in KWRW, including 7 multi-hulls.

TMM offerings of interest: On THIS Saturday, January 29 at 4:00pm, **The Mariners' Museum will host popular maritime fiction author David Poyer**. Poyer, a sailor himself, has a new sailing novel out, *Ghosting*, and will be speaking on writing maritime historical fiction.
