SEA STAR WINS THE LABROT TROPHY

The LaBrot Trophy is very possibly the most coveted trophy among keel boat racers competing in the Handicap Division on the Chesapeake Bay. Each year, since 1940, CBYRA awards the LaBrot to one boat among more than a thousand who race through the season. The LaBrot trophy is based on Bay-wide competition. **Sea Star**, **David Eberwine**, became only the 8th racer from the Southern Bay (CBYRA Region 4) to win the honor. The most recent previous winner was Dave's dad, **Vernon "Bumps" Eberwine** in 2000. The first southern Bay winner of the LaBrot, **Fred Swink**, hailed from Norfolk Yacht and Country Club; the seven who have won it since Fred all are out of Hampton Yacht Club.
