Gene's *Pterodactyl* was the fastest rated boat in the fleet of 24, so he started after everyone else. But, he passed all 23 and finished well ahead of most. Second across the finish line and very close to *Pterodactyl* was *Rumble*, **Ben and Michel Weeks' J29**, sailing out of Yorktown.
