MERIDAN X and MIDNIGHT MISTRESS take firsts in fleets at Screwpile. The 12 southern Bay boats who raced at the 20th rendition of the mid-summer event in Solomons, Maryland, were treated to trademark SCREWPILE fare - racing, rum, and good times all around. The party began with check-in on Saturday (July 14th) and wound up Tuesday (17th) late afternoon with the final awards presentation. The gathering of 123 race entries included boats from the Chesapeake Bay and beyond, 30 of which were multihulls racing for Corsair championships. The racing on all three courses was challenging at times when the air went light to fluky. But, a substantial sea breeze hit for the last race of the last day and racers were treated to perfect conditions and a postrace spinnaker ride to the harbor. It turns out that the weather gods had been smiling on the regatta. The day after Screwpile, the temperatures soared to 100+ degrees. Two southern Bay boats won their fleets. Sledd Shelhorse, Meridian X (Farr 400) won the PHRF A0 two boat duel that was decided by the tie-breaker rule. Pat and Jake Brodersen, Midnight Mistress (C&C 35), won the PHRF Non-Spin class after battling for three days with southern Bay friend Leo Wardrup, Black Widow (Irwin 38), who finished 2nd in the 6 boat fleet. In the PHRF A1 fleet (14 boats), Pete Hunter, Wariere (Thompson 30), took 3rd place, Sam Mitchener, Double Eagle (J109) was 5th, and Leroi Lissenden, Voodoo 2 (Tripp 38) finished 8th. In the 18 boat fleet PHRF B fleet, Dennis Hannick, Goin', brought the Tripp 26 in 5th, and Miles Booth, Shenanigan, Tartan 10, was 15th. In PHRF C (10 boats), Brad Miller's Schiehallion (Beneteau 30), finished 8th, and in PHRF A2 Rod Whittet and Steve Utley, Wavelength (C&C 37), were 15th in the 19 boat fleet. In the J105 One-Design fleet (12 boats), **Dave Wilbar**, Special K finished 10th and Mike Karn, Inevitable, 12th. The dates for <u>SCREWPILE 2013</u> are July 21, 22, and 23, 2013 (check-in on Saturday, July 20th). Mark it down!

Racing with "eyes to the skies" on Saturday in Hampton Roads, twenty-six (26) boats raced in the HOMETOWNE REGATTA sponsored each year by Portsmouth Boat Club. This was the first year for the regatta at its new July slot on the calendar, moved from the June Harborfest weekend. Weather prognosticators had predicted wet and stormy for the afternoon, and race officials were able to avoid thunder boomers by shortening the race on the course in a timely manner. The <u>Garland Culpepper Perpetual Award</u> for winning his class by the largest corrected time margin was awarded to **Bob Archer**, *Bad Habit* (Pearson Flyer) in the PHRF B fleet. <u>RESULTS: PHRF A (4 boats)</u> – 1.Christian Schaumloffel, *Mirage*; 2.Phil Briggs, *Feather*. <u>PHRF B (3 boats)</u> – 1.Bob Archer, *Bad Habit*; 2.Graham Field, *Independence*. <u>PHRF C (4 boats)</u> – 1.Bumps Eberwine, *Spray*; 2.Ralph Edwards, *Sorellina*. <u>PHRF Non-Spin (4 boats)</u> – 1.Walt Boatwright, *Puff Card*; 2.Louie Lewis, *Incentive III*. <u>Cruising Fleet (11 boats)</u> – 1.Joe Creecy, *Anhinga*; 2.Frank Hunt, *Patriot*; 3.Robert Burnell, *Tempo*. Principal Race Officer – Larry Bryant.

Little Bay Challenge was bedeviled with thunder squalls and racer Dave Nichol said that there was "... so much rain with heavy wind that at times it was almost impossible to see." Bob Archer, who has been doing the Little Bay Challenge since 1995, and the crew of Bad Habit sailed on through the rain and wind to win the fastest fleet out there. Blue Fleet (10 boats) 1.Justin Morris, The Hunter, 2.Steve Ritz, Excelisor, 3.Dave Washbourne, Valcour. Yellow Fleet (11 boats) 1.Jeff Rogers, Halaha; 2. Viola; 3. Cliff Porter, Scoundrel. Principal Race Officer – Scott Almond. In the points competition among Hampton Roads clubs and sailing associations, Hampton Yacht Club finished 1st, Old Point Comfort was 2nd, and Willoughby Racers (BBSA) was 3rd out of the 7 area groups who had boats participating. Overall LBC had 41 entries of which 37 raced and 28 finished. BBSA and PBC teamed up on this event, with BBSA handling the racing and PBC doing the party.

<u>Deltaville Maritime Museum</u> was devastated by fire last Wednesday, July 18th. Damage is extensive. Four main display rooms and the pavilion and all the boats under it were destroyed.
