PLANTATION LIGHT RACE. With the wind South and steady, 17 boats saw Plantation Light, aka Cape Charles Lighted buoy "1", in their evening travels. The PHRF A and PHRF B course (58.90 nm) included Wolf Trap Light and the PHRF C and PHRF NS course (46.10nm), York Spit Light. One of the PHRF C skippers, **Justin Morris**, sailing his 26.5 Hunter, said he and the crew "...finished around 5:30 this morning... pretty hard night!" *****STINGRAY POINT REGATTA – August 31 – Sept 2.** Celebrate Labor Day Weekend at a long standing southern Bay regatta racing on the Bay (in the vicinity of the Rappahannock River) off the mouth of the Piankatank (Deltaville area), hosted by Fishing Bay Yacht Club. Regatta check-in opens at 0900, Friday morning and, again this year, SPR will offer a Friday distance race, starting a 1300. The distance race is scored separately from the Saturday and Sunday races. The regatta is open to all PHRF classes, Cruising fleet boats, and one-design [keel boat] classes (with a sufficient number of entries). Shore side regatta activities include post-racing dinners, continental breakfasts, a Labor Day cookout (Sunday), awards presentations, and plenty of socializing!
