The middle day of the 3-day CCV Spring Series looked daunting to a small chunk of the fleet. Actually, the wind was not often more than high teens, but early morning weather forecasts warned of possible gusts to 30. The Old Dominion University women's sailing team earned a spot in the 2013 ICSA/Sperry Topsider Women's National Championships for the fifth consecutive year by taking fifth place at the *MAISA Women's Championships* over the weekend at Hampton University. This coming weekend, on April 27-28, the ICSA Dingy National Semifinals, hosted by ODU and Hampton University, will be sailed in Hampton Roads. Weekend before this past, at the CNU Sailing Center, Christopher Newport University hosted the 2013 Leroy Grant Regatta for the benefit of the William & Mary, Penn State, Villanova, Maryland, Ocean County, Hampton, Queens, and Syracuse sailing teams.
