Thunderstorms cut CUT CHANNEL RACE short. Seventeen (17) racers set out from Fishing Bay Saturday for their annual Cut Channel Race, part of the club's distance race series. The intrepid fleet sailed in the face of warnings of light winds and/or thunderstorms. As it turned out they had some of both. Principal Race Officer Noel Clinard said he shortened the race when boomers brought downpours and some lightning. 2013 VIRGINIA GOVERNOR'S CUP. There were 55 entries, along with 23 Optimist Division sailors, in the 2013 Virginia Governor's Cup, hosted this past weekend at Ware River Yacht Club. In addition to hosting the Hampton One Design National Championship, WRYC provided one-design racing for 8 classes over the two days. <u>One-Design Class Winners:</u> Albacore: **Bob Bear**; Buccaneer: **Jimmy Yurko**; HOD: **Latane Montague**; International Moth: **John Zseleczky**; Laser: **Richard Biggs**; Laser Radial: **Alexander Hanna**; 420: **Victor Layne**; Optimist: **John Vail.** Event Chairman – Clayton James. As winner of the *class with the largest number of qualified starts (Laser Radial), **Alexander Hanna also is the 2013 recipient of the Virginia Governor's Cup.** *NOTE: HOD class excluded from eligibility for Gov. Cup because of national championship status.

The 2013 HOD National Champion is Latane Montague. Latane was undefeated – finished 1st – in each of the 5 races contested by the 11 boat fleet at the Virginia Governors Cup. This makes Latane's win his 7th HOD National Championship, the all time highest number of titles. Crewing with Latane were **Jackson Montague** on two days **and Leigh Chapman** on Sunday. **Gordon Wolcott** with crew sister **Sarah Wolcott** finished 2nd overall among the HODs and **Randy Stokes and sister Ann Stokes** were 3rd overall. **Colin Voigt** won the Outstanding Crew Award; he sailed with **Bill Van Buren**. **Joe Morgan and crew Bill Taylor** won the Willy Hurst Novice Trophy.

The Virginia Governor's Cup has a lot of skippers who return year after year. One in particular, Hampton Roads racer **Emory Nemeth** missed the Governor's Cup this year in favor of a grand adventure. Emory says that he and his crew, Caitlin, are preparing the boat, a Tasar, ". . . *to go cross country to Cascade Locks, aka the Gorge,* [where they will be racing in] *the Tasar Worlds in August.*" He says, "*The sad part will be missing one of our favorite regattas the Virginia Governors Cup.*" NOTE: The Tasar is a 4.5 m high performance sailing dinghy, designed to be sailed and raced by a man and a women. A light weight, low drag, planing hull, a rotating mast, and a jib and fully battened mainsail with efficient sail controls provide exhilarating sailing without the need for spinnaker or trapeze.

Congratulations to southern Bay Opti racer Boyd Bragg. Boyd finished 29th overall in the 117 boat Opti fleet at the **Volvo Gill Optimist British National & Open Championships in Scotland**. He was the 4rd American after 11 races were tallied with two throw-outs. The weather in Scotland was extreme some days – extremely light and then extremely heavy. The main junior fleet sailed in 27 knot winds and heavy rain on Thursday. Heavy conditions were so bad Friday, the last scheduled day of the regatta, that racing was abandoned after only one race. Boyd is the son of Bo and Camilla Bragg and sails out of Rappahannock River and Fishing Bay Yacht Clubs.
