SUMMER SOLSTICE THIS COMING SATURDAY, JUNE 21stAT UTC 10:51

The 2014 **International A-Class Catamaran North American Championship** was decided on Croatan Sound in Manteo, North Carolina, this past week. New Zealander Bruce Mahoney won the title by one point over Australian Ben Moon. Fifty-one (51) of these Formula One, high tech speedsters were at the Outer Banks site to test their boats and skills against one another. **Three southern Bay racers were in the fray**. **Tracy Oliver** finished 10th overall, **Ron Roth**19th, and Tracy's son, **Galt Oliver** 36th. Galt was, by far, the lightest and youngest of the sailors battling the high spirited boats and the conditions (often gusty and mostly choppy). Also, from the Southern Bay on the course running the races was event Principal Race Officer, John McCarthy, along with RC team members Scott Almond, Joe Bousquet, Buk Lawrence, Tom and Annette Connors, Diane Quinn, and Lin McCarthy. Volunteers from the local area provided and staffed the mark boats for the racing Tuesday through Saturday.

Good racing breezes and friendly skies were on hand for the annual **Cock Island Race**Saturday. Sixty-nine (69) raced of the eight-four boats entered. The Cruising Class of 40 boats was divided among <u>5 Cruising Fleets</u>; the winners of those fleets were: **Bob Howell**, *Cymru*; **Ed Harbour**, *Slice*; **Bruce Clarke**, *Celerity*; **Joe Creecy**, *Anhinga*, and **Donald Wilfon**, *Plumb Crazy*. Principal Race Officer – John Ritter. *NOTE*: In PHRF C, it appears in order to have a podium finish, the skipper must have had to have a name that is some version of "*Steve*"!

This race counts in the CCV High Point standings.

It was *FOLLY!* **Doug Miller,** who by his own admission has not raced in years, was "out of practice", and brought up the rear of the fleet, corrected to first on nine (9) other competitors in the **HYC Annual Doublehanded Race** weekend before last. Doug, took first place, **Bob Archer**, *Bad Habit*, 2nd, and **Ty Madden**, *Pterodacty*I, 3rd in the race run by Rich Wilcox.

Three **FBYC Opti Race Team**members at the prestigious, by-invitation-only **USODA National Developmental Team "Boot Camp". Brenton Amthor, Boyd Bragg, and Nathan Smith** were among 65 (60 USA and 5 British National Team) of the best Opti sailors in the country competing in Annapolis week before last. After 4 days of racing and training Brenton finished 4th and Boyd was 11th. Special recognition as "Top Gun" was bestowed upon Brenton Amthor while Boyd Bragg qualified as a full time member of the National Developmental Team. It is interesting to note that parents are not allowed to accompany their kids to the Boot Camps. The sailors must stay with host families and are coached by top professional coaches flown in by USODA.
