SOLSTICE, RUMBLE, and MIDNIGHT MISTRESS win fleets in Moonlight Triangle. What an evening to be on the lower Chesapeake! Sixteen (16) boats filled with racers headed out to do the CCV Moonlight Triangle Race. The first signal was at 5:00pm, so racers were well underway, most on the last leg, by the time the spectacular moon rose over the Bay. The delightful wind, 10-15 knots throughout, with the beginnings of whitecaps made for a "what's-not-to-like race". The PHRF A and B fleets went 21.70 nm and all others 14.80 nm. Skippers Meeting is on Thursday at 1915 (7:15 pm) at regatta headquarters at the Holiday Inn Solomons. PHRF classes and one-design classes will race Friday thru Sunday while the inaugural SPLC Strictly Cruising Class will race only on Saturday and Sunday (for a reduced entry fee). The Saturday race format for all classes is a distance race that will finish at the downtown SOLOMONS PIER. Join them for a mid-summer adventure and some great racing.

Only partial results for the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Southern Chesapeake Leukemia Cup Regatta are available at publication time. The PHRF and One Design classes got in 4 races over the two days (Saturday and Sunday) in Deltaville. Saturday in the RappahannockRiver area was not favored by Ma Nature with the best of sailing winds, but Sunday was better. Broad Bay Sailing Association has honored recently passed, long time member Leo Wardrup in two very significant ways: the BBSA Sailor of the Year Award has been renamed for Leo, and BBSA's largest annual event has been re-named the Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup in his memory.

The 2014 Hampton One Design (HOD) National Championships will be held in conjunction with Fishing Bay Yacht Club 75<sup>th</sup> Annual One Design Regatta (AOD). The HOD class will begin racing on Friday, Aug 8<sup>th</sup>, and the other AOD fleets will race Saturday and Sunday (Aug 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>). To compete for the HOD National Championship, an owner must meet the class requirement of already having sailed during the current year in two class CBYRA sanctioned regattas. It is interesting that at the recent Wolcott Memorial Regatta, hosted by Norfolk Yacht & Country Club, a relative newcomer to the class was the overall winner. College student Graham Landy, with crew Dixon Smith, bested the competition. Yes, that is the Nation's-top-collegiate-sailor-for-2014 Graham Landy, who has racked up beaucoup awards while a member of the Yale University team. This coming weekend is also the start of the 106<sup>th</sup> running of the **Chicago Yacht Club Race to Mackinac** and **Sledd Shelhorse**'s *Meridian X* and crew will be on the starting line. The Cruising Divisions go on Friday, July 18<sup>th</sup>, and *Meridian X* will start on Saturday, July 19<sup>th</sup>when the Racing Divisions begin the oldest annual freshwater distance race in the world.

A passel of J70's will be in Rochester, NY, for the **J70 North American Championship**. Among those signed up as of this morning (Monday) are southern Bay racers: **Ron Thompson** (Yorktown, VA), **Latane Montague** (Alexandria, VA), and two Vortex boats sailed by **Neil Ford** (Hampton) and **Colin Kirby**. All boats must be on the site by Wednesday and there will be *practice* racing that day. The real racing begins on Thursday, July 17<sup>th</sup>, and runs through Sunday, July 20<sup>th</sup>. **BBSA offers the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual LITTLE BAY CHALLENGE (Saturday, July 19) for southern Bay racers this coming weekend.** This is a non-spinnaker, single headsail race for all.
