SCREWPILE 2014 – IT'S A KEEPER! WAIRERE (A1), HORIZON (C), and MIDNIGHT MISTRESS (NS) win their fleets at Solomons. These Top Dogs are all Southern Bay racers – Peter Hunter (Wairere) hails from Kill Devil Hills, NC, Bob and Lisa Fleck (Horizon) sail out of Fishing Bay YC, and Jake and Pat Brodersen (Midnight Mistress) are from Hampton YC and won at this years 3-day event in Solomons, MD. This Screwpile was different from past Screwpiles. First, the event moved to a weekend date as opposed to the previous Sunday thru Tuesday schedule: second. SPLC added a distance race on Saturday for all fleets, finishing at the downtown Solomons Pier, where spectators were agog and close enough to see faces of the crew; third, the Screwpile Strictly Cruising Class was inaugurated and turned out to be the largest class at the regatta with 19 boats. Undoubtedly much will be written elsewhere about the huge success of Screwpile 2014: all 75 boats sailing the last leg of the distance race together (most under spinnaker) up the Patuxant River to the finish line; the Saturday night "cook you own steak" soiree under the regatta tent; the great wind on Saturday and Sunday (repress Friday!); the Screwpilers Boat Parade off the downtown docks after the finish on Saturday; the event volunteers pre-racing appreciation gathering at the headquarters site; the standing room only swimming pool filled with racers each afternoon; the rum; the awards; the friendships (previously seasoned and newly made), and the laughter. Southern Bay Racers in Far Away Waters:

The **2014 J70 Class North American Championships** were sailed this weekend at Rochester Yacht Club in New York. Ron Thompson finished in the top half of the 71 boat fleet with a 33rd overall. Latane Montague was 54th overall in his new J70. Collin Kirby sailed one of the Vortex boats to a 47th overall finish and Neil Ford finished 59th in the other. John and Beverly Blais' Beneteau 36.7, *Stardancer*, raced in the **New York Yacht Club Race Week in Newport** and finished 9thin the 11 boat IRC 3 fleet, 22 in IRC overall. Sledd Shelhorse and the *Meridian X* crew are on the water, having started Saturday on the almost 300 nm race from **Chicago to Mackinac**. Southern Bay racers are "out there". . . racing, too!

The racing is from Little Creek (Norfolk) to Cape Charles (overnight stop at Kings Creek Marina) to finish line off Buckroe (Hampton). Skippers Meeting on Friday, August 15th at Bay Point Marina (East Beach area, Norfolk). Cape Charles Cup offers two distance races with a party stop at Cape Charles in between races.
