CCV Fall Series, Day 2, Race #3. Intentions were to have the middle race of the Fall Series in the Bay off Buckroe, but Mother Nature had other plans. With left over big slop from the just ending 24 hours of Northeast wind and small craft warnings, the impending wind-against-current conditions made moving back into Hampton Roads Harbor a savvy move. Once situated the fleet turned in a glorious Fall afternoon of racing around government marks for the scheduled single middle distance race. The PHRF A and PHRF B fleets each went 11 nautical miles, while PHRF C and PHRF Non-Spin logged just over 8nm. Of the 25 boats racing, all finished. RESULTS. PHRF Non-Spin (4 boats): 1.Leo Wardrup's Crew, Black Widow; 2.John Wandling, Rebecca J; 3.Vicki Zimmerman, Bona Dea. Principal Race Officer-John McCarthy; Signal Boat Captain-Greg Edwards (Magic II); Official Scorer-John Ritter.

CCV Fall Series skips this coming weekend and resumes for the final day of competition on Sunday, October 5, for Day 3, Races 4 & 5 in the Harbor, drop mark courses. In the Preliminary Series Standings there are several close races to be resolved. After three races, two points separate *Sea Star* and *Mirage* from the top spot in PHRF A, and in PHRF B *Cool Change* leads *Rumble* by only 2. In PHRF C, the top 3 boats, *Rocket J, The Hunter*, and *roundabout* are one point out of the next spot, up or down. *Black Widow* can wrap up the PHRF Non-Spin fleet if all goes well. And, there are close situations throughout each of the fleets at numerous positions. This will be the last of the races that comprise the annual CCV High Point competition.

Flying Scot Atlantic Coast Championship, hosted Saturday and Sunday by Fishing Bay Yacht Club. **David Neff (SBSC) and crew Jason Hair are the 2014 FS ACC champs**. Over the 5 races (4 on Saturday and 1 on Sunday) they put together a string of 9-1-2-1-3 to finish 2 points ahead of southern Bay racers **Rob Whittemore (FBYC) and crew John Wake** who finished 2ndoverall in the 22 boat

There was a 12 boat Challenger Division (self declared) and **Phil Webb (FBYC) and crew Jim Lytle** took 2nd overall. Neff and Hair also won the Capitol District Championship.
