'Round the Lights Race takes time. Saturday was a beautiful day but, regarding racing conditions, not so much. Winds were light to non-existent at times and the current was ripping in Hampton Roads. Nevertheless, of the 44 boats that started this annual pursuit extravaganza, 22 finished. Fifteen (15) of the finishers beat the time limit by less than an hour – endurance was the name of the game. To round Thimble Shoal Light first proved to the "right way" to go. Six (6) in the fleet made the correct call, but even then only 2 of those were able to finish. As usual, there was a great awards party at OPCYC and a good time had by all. **Overall winner and first in the PHRF A Fleet** – *Pterodactyl*, Gene Thayer (14:46:12). Second overall and 2nd in PHRF A, *Mirage*, Christian Schaumloffel (14:48:33) Fleet winner for PHRF B was *Haka*, Ryan McCrillis (16:25:05) and for PHRF C was *The Hunter*, Justin Morris (17:15:19). John Wandling, *Rebecca J* (16:23:59) won the PHRF NS fleet and the Cruising winner was *Seeker*, E.A. Johnson. The inaugural Race For Independence had 31 boats filled with optimistic sailors along with guest veterans take to the race course for the first day of the event, on Saturday. On Saturday the fleet started Day 4 for the **FBYC Fall Series**in 10-14 and it was looking good. However, by the 2nd lap the wind completely died and

nobody finished within the time limit. After a bit of waiting for wind, racing was called off for the day. The wind was in the 20's, but 3 Flying Scots and 3 Front Runners went out. 1 Front Runner and 2 Flying Scots finished 1 race. The others retired. Turning turtle counts as "retired".
