**Answer to RR Quiz Question:** Never; you can run your engine as long as you like. It just cannot be used for propulsion once you are racing (racing begins when your prep signal is raised, 4 minutes before your start). So, as long as your engine is in neutral, you can run it. Of course, your competitor may look askance when he sees that water discharge coming out of your stern. [Ref: US Sailing, The Racing Rules of Sailing, *Definitions: Racing*; and, *Rule 42 – Propulsion*]
