Jim Muldoon in his Andrews 80, Donnybrook, undoubtedly will be looking to repeat his 2009 win of the Virginia Cruising Cup, although in a different Donnybrook. And, of course, Ben Cuker, Callinectes, will be back defending his 2014 win.
