CCV Founders Race. SEA STAR, COOL CHANGE, and LONA B win fleets. The sailing conditions, steady breeze (10-15) and flat water, were perfect yesterday off of Ocean View (Norfolk) for the fourteen (14) boats, skippers and crew. There was close racing, especially in the PHRF A fleet (4 boats) where Bumps Eberwine, Sea Star, won by 2 seconds (corrected) over Leroi Lissenden, Voodoo 2. Phil Briggs, Feather, took 3<sup>rd</sup> in PHRF A. PHRF B (6 boats): 1.Rusty Burshell, Cool Change; 2.Bob Archer, Bad Habit; 3.Ben Weeks and Michele Cochran, Rumble. PHRF C (4 boats): 1.Cary Hardesty, Lona B; 2.Justin Morris, The Hunter; 3.Louie Lewis, Incentive. The only non-spinnaker boat on the course chose to sail with the C fleet. Principal Race Officer, Bob Thomas; Mark Boat, Dave Hamilton.

Cut Channel Regatta. Fourteen (14) boats started the annual FBYC Cut Channel Regatta Saturday at noon and sailed the 27.8 nm course, the latest boat crossing the finish line by 17:25:20. In the two boat PHRF A fleet, Craig Wright, Afterthought, finished 13 seconds ahead of sistership J109, Double Eagle (Sam Mitchener). In PHRF B (3 boats), Wayland Rennie, Trilogy, corrected to first over 2<sup>nd</sup> place Miles Booth, Shenanigan followed by Eric Powers in Nereid. In PHRF C (4 boats), Brad Miller, Schiehallion, was first to finish and held his time over Morningtide (no skipper's name listed), and Ardent, Denton Roberts. In the largest fleet, PHRF Non-Spin (5 boats), George Jones, Delphinus, finished first and held his time, with Incorrigible (Gregory Watt) finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> and Sherpa (no skipper's name listed), third. **28th Annual CI Race.** *STARDANCER* **wins Hanbury Cup.** Around 60 boats tried to start the race against flooding current in a light breeze, which died about one hour after the start. Of the boats racing, six (6) were able to beat the 3pm time limit, finishing at the Portsmouth seawall against a south breeze and by then ebbing current.
