CCV MOONLIGHT TRIANGLE. *MIRAGE, RUMBLE, and CALLINECTES* win their fleets. Things for this race got started at 5PM and all boats were finished well before midnight. The fleet started off Buckroe and finished between a range light and the orange flag on a Fort Monroe rock groin. The courses were 21.7 nm for the PHRF A and PHRF B fleets, and 14.8 nm for the PHRF C and PHRF Non-Spin boats. PRO Rich Payne described conditions as, "A Chamber of Commerce evening - no clouds, low humidity, wind a steady 10 knots from the east (clocking to the south later in the race). Nice moon (though not full) too, once it got dark." Only one (1) PHRF-Non-Spin boat sailed, Alan Johnson's Seeker. Principal Race Officer-Rich Payne; Official Scorer-John Ritter.
