Cape Charles Cup. Yes, it was the Leo Wardrup Memorial Cape Charles Cup weekend and, yes, both races, from Norfolk to Cape Charles and from Cape Charles to Hampton, were eventually shortened due to wind conditions that made shortening imperative to getting the fleet over the finish line by the time limit. Nevertheless, of the 88 boats entered, 69 sailed in at least one of the two races. Let it be said that a gazillion skippers, crew, family and friends attended the Saturday party at Oyster Farm Marina (Cape Charles) and many of those enjoyed the after-party party-ing in downtown Cape Charles establishments. There are two Cape Charles Cups awarded, one for the PHRF Division (36 boats racing) and one for the Cruising Division (32 boats racing). The winners are defined as the boats having the fasted correct time combined for the two races. This year MIRAGE, Christian Schaumloffel, with a total corrected time of 3 hrs 39 minutes won the PHRF Division. NU POGODI, Andrew Arola, won the Cruising Division with a total corrected time of 2 hours 59 minutes. NOTE: The Cape Charles Cup races are not scored as a series.
