Autumnal Equinox. FALL arrives officially THIS Wednesday, September 23, at 08:21 UTC / 03:21 Eastern DLS

NEPTUNE'S ATLANTIC REGATTA – THIS COMING Saturday, September 26th. This is a STAGGERED START (aka pursuit) race. The starting line is just north of the entrance to Little Creek. The first flag will be at 0925/9:25am. Racers will hang a right around Cape Henry and finish off the Virginia Beach oceanfront in the vicinity of the Old Coast Guard Station, which is at the end 24th St. and the Atlantic Ocean. Monohulls must meet the PHRF of the Chesapeake Safety Equipment Category Ches Bay. There is **complimentary dockage** in Lake Wesley just inside Rudee Inlet for Saturday night. There will be starts for all PHRF Classes and PHRF Non-Spin may fly double headsails. Cruising Fleet boats must fly single headsail only. The \$75 entry fee includes a special gift bag, 2 post-race party wristbands, an event flag and other goodies. **Skippers Meeting on Friday, September 25th at 1830/6:30pm** at The Raven Restaurant parking lot at the corner of 12th and Atlantic. **Entries are due by 1500/3:00pm, THIS TUESDAY (aka tomorrow), September 22nd**. This race is part of the Southern Bay Distance Racing Series administered by BBSA.

CCV Fall Series Day 1 (Races 1&2). Day 1 of CCV Fall Series dished up significant adverse current at the starts (perfect for bargers) and 7-8 knots of building breeze. By the time Race 2 finished, the NNW breeze had built to 12-15 and was perfect for a great ending to the opening of the CCV Fall Series.
