RORC Caribbean 600. Former CBYRA president and southern Bay racer **John Dodge** shares his recent experience on *Donnybrook* in the 2016 Caribbean 600. Get your morning coffee, click on the link, and enjoy! John said, *"I was one of the watch captains on Donnybrook for the 2016 Caribbean 600 ocean race that took place in Antigua last week [start Feb 22] and wanted to share with our Region IV friends a small glimpse of the start. For those not familiar with the race, which started last Monday, it covers 11 islands, starting in Antigua. It winds its way up past Nevis, St. Kitts, Saba, St Barths, around St Maarten, back around St Barths, down to Guadeloupe, around Les Saintes, and back up to Antigua. We had 25 boats of the 70 total in our start, including Comanche, Highland Fling, Bella Mente, and Mono. It was an All Star cast of boats on the line. With high trade winds and confused seas It made for a very punishing race to both crew and boat, with several boats dropping out due to structural damage. We sustained our own issues on Donnybrook, with broken battens that required us to drop the main and make new ones, as well as breaking the steerage cable, which was also fixed. All a compliment to the tireless effort of the crew. Hitting speeds in mid to high 20's as the breeze clocked around made up for the tough 150 miles of beating we did to St Maarten. We were the 8th boat to finish, completing the course in 55 hours. A terrific race!"* <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SKYJi8MyIcc&sns=em>
