Sailing off of Buckroe Beach in a shifty 5-7 knot NNE breeze with sloppy seas, twenty-seven (27) boats finished the middle distance race yesterday, Sunday. PHRF A and B fleets raced on an 11.35 nm course, while PHRF C and Non-Spin went 6.85 nm. Racing began at 11am and the last boat to cross the finish line did so at 3pm straight up. NEPTUNE'S ATLANTIC REGATTA, this coming Saturday, October 1st, will be a race from just North of Little Creek to the finish line established off the Old Coast Guard Station in the 24th Street area of the Virginia Beach oceanfront. This is a staggered start, i.e. pursuit race, where the slower boats start first, the hope being that everyone finishes together (that has yet to happen in the history of pursuit racing in the southern Bay!). The first flag is at 0925. The race is open to PHRF A, B, C and Non-Spin (single headsail only) as well as Cruising Fleet boats. There is a Skippers Meeting at 1830 on Friday, September 30 in the Raven Restaurant parking lot (corner of 12th and Atlantic, at the oceanfront). **All** boats must meet PHRF of the Chesapeake Safety Equipment Requirements Category Ches Bay.
