IMPORTANT INFO for HAMPTON ROADS RACERS AND VISITING RACERS: This week there will be two public hearings regarding the proposed improved HRBT crossing. Wednesday, Aug 15 (5-7pm) at Ocean View Elementary School-Norfolk on Willoughby Spit at 4th View near Harrison's Fishing Pier and Thursday, Aug 16 (5-7pm) at Saint Mary Star of the Sea School-Hampton at Phoebus, on North Willard). The Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel serves as the main link between Norfolk and Hampton, two of the most populated sailing areas in Hampton Roads. All of our racers and racing visitors will be affected by the HRBT improvements which are planned to include the area of I-64 from Settlers Landing Exit 267 in Hampton to I-565 Exit 276 in Norfolk. The project will include 2 additional, full-time lanes, 2 part-time shoulder lanes, and a new bridge tunnel crossing of Hampton Roads. Racers and crew who regularly use the HRBT to get to clubs and marinas on "the other side" are encouraged to attend these public meetings.
