**2019 New Year Madness is in the books. Jeff Rogers and the crew of *Halaha* earned bragging rights until Spring, having won the annual New Year's Madness Race** on the first racing day in 2019, Tuesday, January 1. HAPPY NEW YEAR and congratulations to the 23 boats, skippers and crews who sailed in the pursuit race provided by Old Point Comfort YC and Hampton YC. The festivities started with breakfast and a skippers meeting in the HYC Dockside Lounge, the racing started off the HYC docks, and competitors sailed a pre-announced course which finished in Mill Creek, with OPCYC hosting a post-race party and awards presentations. There was plenty of wind and warm air temps (touching the low 70's), almost like "in the islands, Mon!". The TOP 5 finishers were: 1. **Jeff Rogers, *Halaha***; 2. **John Edwards, *Recovery***; 3. **Ben Cuker, *Callinectes***; 4. **Phil Briggs, *Feather***, and, **Pete Hunter, *Wairere***.

**Bon Voyage, *Charis*, and Welcome, *Courageous*!** Dick McCrillis' wooden yawl *Charis* has been sold to a Mainer and by now, after a cruise part of the way up the Chesapeake, has been trucked the rest of the way to her new home in Maine. The new owner plans a two year overhaul under cover, followed by a re-launch and continuation of her beautiful heritage on the water. Dick and Verna have bought a Cal 39, and they are naming her *Courageous*. Dick said, "We are very much looking forward to getting ourselves back out on the course(s) next year." **Meanwhile, Ian Hill and his crew await the arrival of their new J-111.** She has been prepped (bottom, electronic, etc) in Bristol, R.I and will be in Annapolis for dry fitting of running rigging. The J-111 will then head to St Pete's the following weekend to step the rig and outfit sails. Ian and his crew will meet up with the boat in St Petersburg to prep for J Fest the following weekend. Ian and crew plan to do several major regattas on the east coast (including SBRW 2019). *Courageous* and Ian's J-111 join other newcomers soon to be on the southern Bay: Sledd Shelhorse's *Meridian XI*, and Jake and Pat Brodersen's *Bavaria 44*.
