ST PATRICK'S DAY IS THIS COMING SUNDAY, MARCH 17th – don't let the leprechaun slip by ya!

Safety Equipment Requirements – pay attention. PHRF of the Chesapeake no longer publishes Safety Equipment Requirements (SER) for southern Bay Racers. The responsibility has been passed over to individual organizing authorities (i.e. yacht clubs, sailing associations, event managers, etc) of races. This spring clubs have been deciding on the safety equipment requirements each of them will apply to their races. For example, Hampton Yacht Club will use the *US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements* for their races while CCV has developed their own set of standards. Each of those organizations publishes the entire list of their requirements at their website and refers to them in their Notices of Race. Other clubs may soon announce their SERs and indicate where they may be found. So, be aware that Safety Equipment Requirements are likely to differ from club to club – at least for the time being.

After six days of racing at the Bacardi Cup Invitational Regatta in Miami, and Mary and Geoff Ewenson and Tyler Bjorn won the 19 boat Viper 640 class. The Ewenson boat, Evil Hiss, racked up 4 firsts (in 8 races) including wins in each of the final 3 races. Mary is well known to southern Bay racers as publisher of SpinSheet Magazine (and key sponsor at SBRW and numerous other events). Another southern Bay Viper racing in the extremely competitive class was Peter III's Caterpillar, with crew Mark Wheeler and Joe Donahue (10th overall) In addition to the Viper 640 class, racers competed in J/70, Melges 24, Flying Tigers 7.5 and Star classes. Melges 24 racer, Travis Weisleder of Richmond, brought Lucky Dog in 4th overall in the 25 boat class. Crewing on Lucky Dog were John Bowen, Evea Aras, Jeremy Wilmot, and Caroline (last name not available).
