Using your VHF Radio in busy ports. Tom Roberts, from West Point, VA, shares the following information: Tom said, *Mario Vitrone* wrote a concise one page article in the *June 2019 issue of Soundings* about using VHF radios in busy ports. His examples are all local to Hampton Roads sailors. 1. Know where you are at all times, which buoy you are next to, name of the channel you are crossing, which point of land is closest 2. Use that position to orient yourself in relation to the commercial (ships bigger than you) traffic 3.Listen - if a voice on the radio says " outbound making 23 knots approaching Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel North Island". =. 2.3 miles every six minutes! And limited room to maneuver! 4. Communicate your intentions if necessary using the 1 watt level for vessels close by. 5. Monitor the radio traffic at all times in a crowded harbor. Etc.
