Summer Solstice Ocean Race: Six boats crossed the start line at Buckroe for this 58nm race. The course was out the mouth of the Chesapeake Bay into the Ocean, round Chesapeake Light (14 miles off Cape Henry) and back. First warning was at 0800. This was the third rendition of the SSOR. Sledd Shelhorse and the *Meridian XI* crew finished the race in just over 8 hours (finish time = 16:06:24.0). A pretty darn good first outing for the new water rocket. Greg Cutter in *Diablo* finished 2nd in PHRF A, followed by Christian Schaumloffel, *Myrage* (3rd) and Dixon Wilde, *Kingfisher* (4th). Two PHRF B/C boats, *Callinectes* and *Bad Habit*, rounded out the field. Ben Cuker brought *Callinectes* to the finish line at 22:08:44.0, just in the nick of time, relatively speaking, since the official time limit was 2300. Bob Archer and the *Bad Habit* crew, were doing just fine until, when shortly after rounding Chesapeake Light, they experienced a rigging failure and had to motor home. They vow to go again next year though. Conditions for this SSOR were near ideal, even though the wind did fall out a bit around late afternoon. Racers were blessed with a flooding current on the return leg. Race organizers did a good job of scheduling the race around favorable currents. CCV Racing organized the event; Event Chairman: Christian Schaumloffel; Principal Race Officer: Brian Deibler.

This coming Saturday, July 29th, the HAMPTON HISTORY MUSEUM will open a new exhibit – *HAMPTON ONE: Working, Building and Racing on the Water*. The description of Hampton in the exhibit says, in part, there is "... passion for sailing as embodied in the locally developed **Hampton One sailboat**, and the competitive sailing culture that grew out of it." The Hampton One Design (HOD) was designed by Vincent Serio and launched in the 1930s. A restored HOD and a half-completed boat, tools, forms and photographs are included in the exhibit. The Museum hours are Mon thru Sat - 10:00am – 5:00pm; on Sun – 1:00pm – 5:00pm. Cost: Adults = \$5; Military, Seniors, AAA, and 5-12 yrs = \$4. Little Ones, i.e. 4yrs and younger, get in FREE. Check out the exhibit and enjoy downtown Hampton – park once and stroll the pedestrian-friendly streets, by-ways, shops, the working waterfront, and eateries. And, check-out the Virginian Air and Space Center / NASA Langley Visitor Center (which includes wonderful wonders of space and science and an IMAX theater).

Sledd Shelhorse's MERIDIAN XI is in the house! The built-in-Dubai, brand new Carkeek 40 is snug in her slip at Hampton Yacht Club. She arrived (by ship) in Norfolk a little over 10 days ago, main commissioning was

at Bluewater Yachting Center, and the builder's top reps, *Meridian* crew, and local/stateside gurus finished off the setting-up at her slip. She did her shakedown-workup sail Wednesday and then won the Summer Solstice Ocean Race on Saturday (see item above). Prevailing opinion is, "OMIG, that is one sexy sailboat!" Congratulations to Sledd Shelhorse and his crew, who for many years have represented southern Chesapeake Bay racing with class and aplomb, and best wishes for this new adventure.

BBSA Championship – BBSA Little Creek Sailing Assoc vs BBSA Willoughby Racers. And, it's a 3-peat - the Little Creek branch of the family wins and holds on to the BBSA Bold Mariner Cup for 2019, the 3rd consecutive year! The big boat racers in Broad Bay Sailling Association (BBSA) are mainly "homeported" at two separate locations – Willoughby Bay and Little Creek. Non-Spin 1 (10 boats): 1.Donna DeSteph, Restless (LC); 2.Bob Howell, Pegasus (LC; 3.Ken Copeland, Carl Gade, & Al Girardin, Black Widow (LC). Non-Spin II (9 boats): 1.Andy Spittler, Wharf Rat (LC); 2. Chris Whately, Kaleidoscope, (LC); 3.Rudy Eash, Brittany. The 7.6 nm course was run off Ocean View. Principal Race Officer-Jonathan Romero; Signal Boat-Kelly Thorp; Official Scorer-Scott Almond.
