FIDDLERS GREEN. A southern Bay sailing champion and icon, **Dan Winters** (80), passed from us Friday, October 25, after a brief stay in the hospital. Dan, along with his wife Sam and son Brett, ran Dan Winters Sailmakers for 40 years in Hampton and through that conduit made endless connections with racers of both big and small boats, of all ages and from all kinds of places. Dan was a standout among race officials and as a judge served on the US Sailing Appeals Board. And, of course, Dan sailed and raced throughout his life up and down his beloved Chesapeake Bay. Dan touched so very many sailors, including any who had an attachment to the Christopher Newport University sailing team. He was twice inducted in the College Sailing Hall of Fame. He was the Head Sailing Coach at CNU for 22 years. It is fitting then that a celebration of his life be planned as “*Dan’s Happy Hour*”, Saturday, Nov 2nd at 3pm at the Christopher Newport Sailing Center, 494 Menchville Rd, Newport News.
